

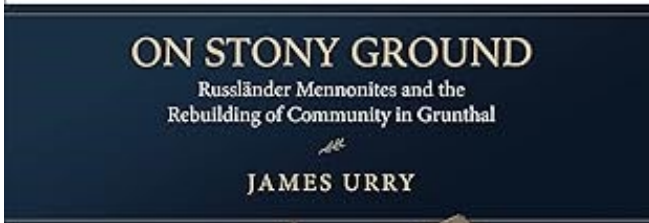

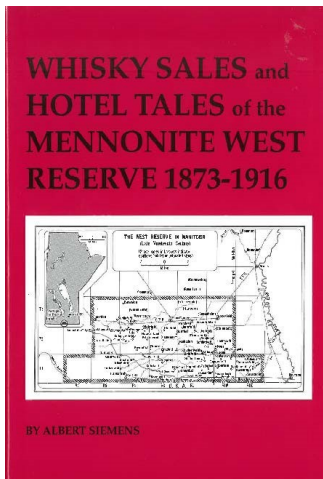
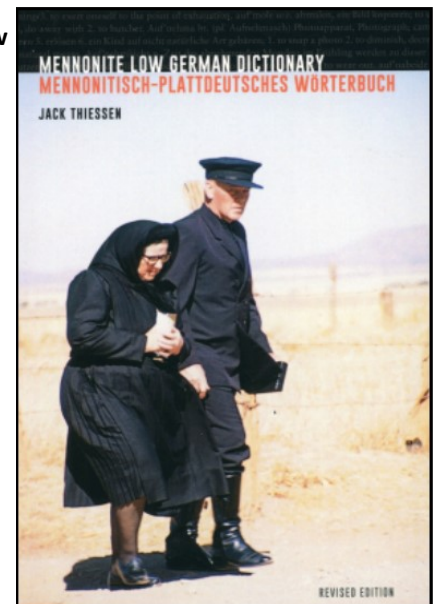


James Urry, **On Stony Ground: Russländer Mennonites and the Rebuilding of Community in Grunthal** (2024) \$42.95

In *On Stony Ground*, historian James Urry presents an account of the Mennonites who immigrated from the Soviet Union to Manitoba during the 1920s. This book explores these people as they settled in Grunthal, through the relationships that existed between neighbours, and their identity in a tumultuous century that included the Depression, the rise of Hitler, and eventual integration into wider Canadian society.

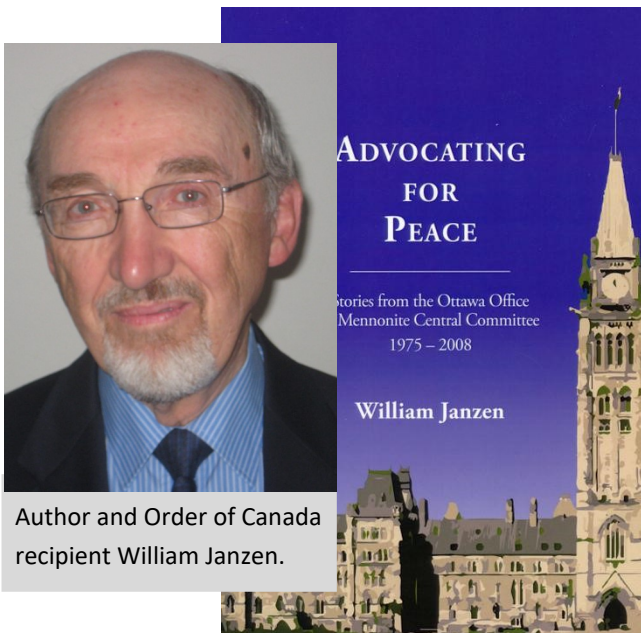

Recognized for his contributions to the development of Canadian immigration policy and other work with the Order of Canada this year, William (Bill) Janzen's book covers his 33 years as director of MCC's Ottawa Office and the recognizable and lesser known events that the office was involved in. These include an instrumental role in the development of the first Private Sponsorship of Refugees agreement, interactions with prime ministers, and advocacy work for the Old Order Mennonite and Amish communities when they faced policies from the Ontario Milk Marketing Board that compromised their traditional farming methods. An insightful and fascinating look at William Janzen's work with Mennonite Central Committee.
